Foodnet undertakes regular audits and reviews of suppliers – as part of our Quality Management System and Supplier Agreements - to ensure they are upholding these standards including technical and quality information.

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We encourage all our suppliers to hold BRC (British Retail Consortium) accreditation or equivalent GFSI standard.

We are a member of SEDEX (Supplier Ethical Data Exchange) and are actively encouraging all suppliers to register and connect. Our aim is that 100% of our suppliers are members.

We use BRC, SEDEX or equivalent accreditation as part of our due diligence with suppliers. We also undertake our own supplier audits where we feel there is a higher risk.
